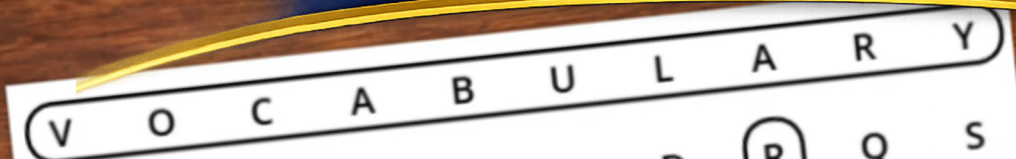

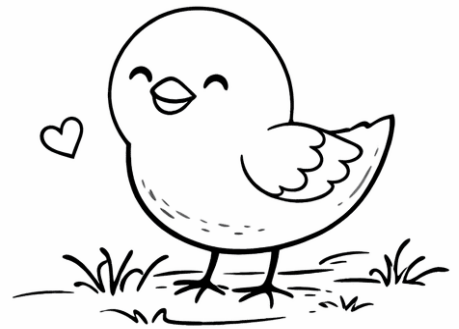

Each puzzle contains a list of hidden vocabulary words. Words may appear:

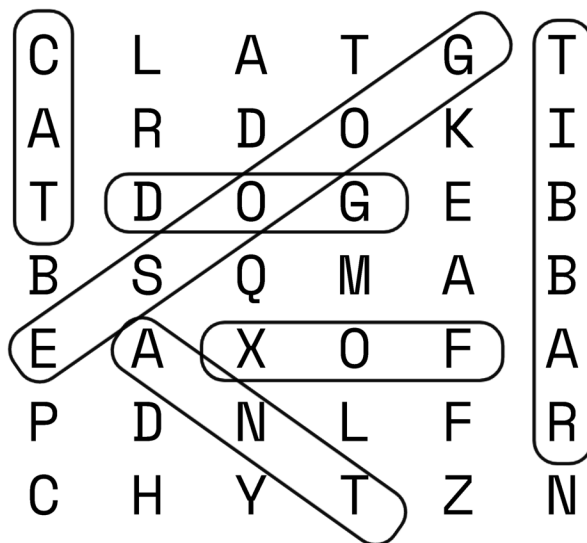
Horizontally (left to right)
